Among younger generations in particular, there is a focus—rhetorically and psychologically—on self-realization achieved through managerialism and instrumental reasoning; they are “project-managing” their lives and identities. For some, the endeavor to construct one’s identity leads to a web of supportive and sustaining relationships and the emerging adult flourishes. For others it creates a field of tension, created by the complex and diverse voices of others represented in the emerging adults’ inner dialogue. This leaves the floundering, as evidenced by the high rates of depression, anxiety, and suicide. What do young people experience, in their own words, when trying to combine myriad voices of family, peers, community expectations, and diverse social mores into a coherent self—if such a thing is possible?</i></p> <p><i>Saint Mary's Press conducted qualitative interviews with a small group of Midwestern women between the ages of 23 and 35, inquiring in both group and individual settings about the process and experience of self-realization. The interviews focused on the participant's perception of self, life, and experience as expressed in her own words. Analysis following these interviews discovered patterns that can yield more questions and foundations of inquiry, with particular implications for higher education, religious, professional, or intergenerational spaces.</i></p>

Encouraging Theological Curiosity in Introductory Courses in Theology

Jennifer Krysak, Saint Thomas University (Florida), Facilitator

Introductory courses provide a foundation for theological knowledge and curiosity. This conversation will consider how professors attend to what is essential in introductory courses and also nurture theological curiosity.

How do Good College Teachers Treat their Students?
